She gingerly nibbled a puny end. The rabbit made a face. "Um, I need some water," she said, clearly trying not to be rude. She hopped away.


"Even the rabbits inhibit their habits when carrots are green," Walter complained.

Recipe Corner: Sweet Toast

Ingredients

1 piece of bread
1 teaspoon powdered sugar
Drizzle of honey
Mini marshmallows (approximately 6)
Chocolate chips (approximately 12)

Instructions

Place the bread on a heat-proof plate or pan. Place mini marshmallows and chocolate chips on the bread. Put the bread in a toaster oven for 8 to 10 minutes or until the marshmallows and chocolate chips have melted. Be careful not to burn.

Remove the bread carefully from the toaster oven using a potholder. *Caution: the plate/pan will be hot.*

Sprinkle powdered sugar and drizzle honey.
