Tips to help kids with GROWTH MINDSET!



A growth mindset is the belief that intelligence and abilities can be grown by embracing challenges and trying new strategies. The opposite is a fixed mindset which is the belief that we are born with certain abilities and we can't do much to change them. Research shows that parents have a big influence on helping foster a growth mindset in their children.

PRAISE!

Focus on praising your child's effort, perseverance, and strategies used to overcome challenges, rather than just the final result.

"YET" LANGUAGE:

When your child expresses difficulty, use phrases like "You can't do it yet" to emphasize that they can learn and improve with time.

EMBRACE MISTAKES

View mistakes as valuable learning experiences and encourage your child to analyze what went wrong and how to do better next time.

ASK OPEN-ENDED QUESTIONS

Encourage critical thinking by asking questions that prompt reflection on strategies and learning processes.

SHARE FACTS ABOUT THE BRAIN

Explain that the brain is like a muscle that can grow and develop with practice.

MODEL IT!

Be open about your own learning experiences and challenges, demonstrating that everyone can grow and improve.

SET REALISTIC GOALS

Encourage your child to set achievable goals and celebrate progress along the way.

ENCOURAGE CURIOSITY

Foster a love of learning by exploring new topics and asking questions together.

AVOID LABELS

Be cautious about labeling your child as "good at math" or "not athletic," as this can limit their perceived potential
